

PENSACOLA'S COLONIAL JAILS

The next in our membership meeting lectures will be presented at 7 PM on Tuesday, Feb. 9 via Zoom. Reservations are required. (Link below)

Meghan Mumford, archaeologist and collections manager for the Archaeology Institute at UWF, will share some part of her thesis research about colonial and early American jails in Pensacola. She has worked on archaeological sites from NW Florida to coastal South Carolina since 2009. She has worked on a variety of terrestrial and underwater sites dating from historic Native American to Euro-American sites, including Spanish and British colonial sites, and Early American to modern industrial sites

Colonial and early American jails were integral institutions that maintained and promoted social order and the enforcement of the law. Pensacola's colonial jail operated during the British (1763-1781) and Second Spanish (1781-1821) periods and briefly into the American Territorial Period (1821-1845) but fell into a state of disrepair near the end of the 1820s. An antebellum period jail, built on the same lot, replaced the derelict colonial jail by 1836 (Pensacola Gazette 1836) and functioned into the mid-19th century (ca. 1861).
