About our December program and speaker:

Rikki Oeters, Anthropology graduate student, UWF

The Emanuel Point Shipwrecks associated with the 1559 Luna expedition have borne witness to the maritime activities occurring overhead and the ensuing development of Pensacola's maritime landscape. These activities ultimately propelled the port of Pensacola to economic success. Meanwhile, alterations in the landscape extended beyond Pensacola's waterfront to the area encompassing the Emanuel Point Shipwrecks. To assess the impacts of Pensacola's maritime activities on the physical environment of the archaeological sites, this presentation discusses the comparison of Pensacola's maritime cultural landscape and the bathymetric history of the Emanuel Point Shipwreck area. In completion, this thesis endeavor aims to analyze the entirety of Pensacola's continually inhabited historic period. To provide an explanatory introduction, the latter half of the nineteenth century is presented here.

Rikki Oeters received a BA in Anthropology from East Carolina University. She is currently a graduate student in the University of West Florida's Historical Archaeology program and is employed by the UWF Historic Trust as a living history interpreter. Her research interests include the analysis of bathymetric data using GIS, historical ecology, cultural landscapes, public engagement and education, and historic preservation.
