Although they need no introduction to most of us, here is a little bit about our speakers.

**Dr. John E. Worth** is a professor of historical archaeology at the University of West Florida in Pensacola. He has conducted archaeological and historical research for 35 years in the Southeastern U.S., focusing on interactions between Native Americans and Spaniards during the colonial era in Florida and Georgia. Dr. Worth will present highlights of the 2021 excavations at the 1559-1561 settlement of Tristán de Luna y Arellano on Pensacola Bay, including evidence for structures as well as artifacts, and will discuss plans for this summer's fieldwork.

**Dr. Ramie Gougeon** has led archaeological field schools for UWF since 2011 on prehistoric and historic sites from Natural Bridge Battlefield Historic State Park outside Tallahassee to Gulf Islands National Seashore in Pensacola, and from cave sites in Marianna to shell middens at the Luna Settlement site. Gougeon will present an overview of two archaeological surveys conducted by graduate students Jenni Baggett and Kara Wallace at Naval Live Oaks in 2021. Two Woodland period mound sites were surveyed to determine site boundaries and the specific cultural components present. The artifacts are currently undergoing analysis and interpretation for Baggett's and Wallace's Master's theses research. Their results will be used to plan future archaeological investigations.

**Meghan Mumford** is the collections manager and a maritime archaeologist for the UWF Archaeology Institute. Tonight, Mumford will present an overview of the Phase III excavations on the EPII Shipwreck site conducted during the 2021 UWF Maritime Field School. In addition, Mumford will discuss the plan for the 2022 maritime field season.
