This month we'll share a bit of information and a few ideas of activities you can take advantage of. Some require gas and others just require a computer. There is something for everyone.

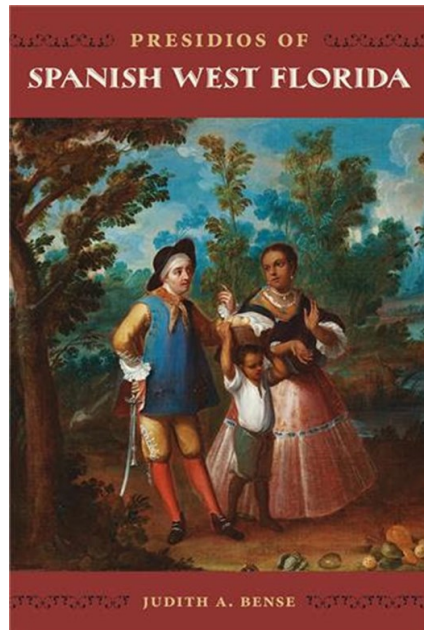
