About our September program and speaker:

Dr. Judy Bense, UWF Archaeology Emerita

Fragments of small ceramic figurines are one of the most interesting types of artifacts recovered from the Spanish presidios of Santa Rosa and San Miguel in Pensacola. These artifacts are extremely rare and are being researched currently. The results are intriguing. This presentation will provide an overview of the presidio figurines, their history in Mexico and an interpretation of when and why they were brought to Pensacola.

Dr. Judy Bense is no stranger to PAS members. She founded the Archaeology program at UWF and grew the academic department of Anthropology. She was also instrumental in the organization of the Archaeology Institute and the Florida Public Archaeology Network. She served as UWF president 2008-2017. She returned to archaeology, retired and has written a synthesis of the Spanish presidio research that was published earlier this year. She is currently researching early colonial forts in the southeast as well as the figurines. Bense chairs the Florida Historical Commission and was recently inducted into the Florida Women's Hall of Fame.
